Contact Cornwall Council for problems related to public rights of way, hedges/verges (by road), floods/blocked drains, antisocial behaviour, dog fouling, flyposting/graffiti on public property, planning issues, abandoned vehicles, pavement, street lights or crossings, debris on road, potholes, worn/broken road markings/signs, road surfaces, dead animals, fly tipping, full litter/dog bin, missed rubbish/recycling collections and more.

VILLAGE SHOP AND POST OFFICE

BUS

The Number 15 bus serves the village Monday to Saturdays (except public holidays and bank holidays) via Treloweth

Lane, Tredrea Lane and Chenhalls Road. Main bus stops are by Treloweth Estate and in Chenhalls Road near the Methodist Chapel. Services towards Hayle call at Chenhalls Bus Stop circa 8:33am, 10:35am, 11:33am, 1:35pm, 2:33pm, 3:33pm and 5:55pm. Services to the Train Station 8:18am, 9:18am, 11:18am, 12:18pm, 2:18pm, 3:18pm, 4:28pm. Three services a day go to/from Marazion and Penzance back to the village. For number 15 help call 0808 196 2632.

More services to Penzance, St Ives, Camborne, Truro and beyond available from the Railway Station.

RAILWAY STATION

'The World is your Oyster' from here, with adequate parking and accessible platforms. Buy your ticket at the station or use the Ticket office which is open Monday to Saturday 7.30am - 2.45pm. Great Western Railway Helpline: 0345 7000 125 (08:00 to 20:00 daily)

RECYCLING

Located off Treloweth Lane. Open every Monday to Sunday, 9am to 4pm (Except 25/26 Dec and 1 Jan). **You must book beforehand** at www.cornwall.gov.uk/tipbooking or 0300 1234 141. Recycle almost everything for free, including batteries, lightbulbs, clothes, mattresses, paints, TVs, tyres, wetsuits. There's now a reuse shop. Certain commercial waste is now accepted. There is a charge for this.

GETTING OUTDOORS IN ST ERTH

PUBLIC TOILETS

In Tredrea Lane, your answer when nature calls. Two parking spaces, accessible entrance and baby changing facilities.

BATTERY MILL PLAYPARK

Featuring swings, and multi-play equipment for the younger children, the timeless roundabout, zip-wire and half-pipe skate ramp. There are several bins, picnic tables and seating. Dogs are not permitted in this area.

ST ERTH NATURE PARK

Situated just beyond the playpark in Battery Mill Lane. Entrances via bridleway, playpark and riverbank. Enjoy accessible path, woodland walk, or sit and enjoy the surrounding nature. A bin is available.

GREEN LANE PARK

Just beside the river in Green Lane is a

peaceful grass area with the youth shelter and several picnic benches.

VICARAGE GATE PLAY AREA

Nestled between Vicarage Gate and Boscarnek is a large grass football pitch.

ST ERTH PITS WILDLIFE SITE

Just 'above' Vicarage Gate. Quiet wildlife walk. Owned and managed by Cornwall Wildlife Trust.

HAYLE RIVER WALK

From the causeway right up to Relubbus (via a diversion). Pick up a Family Activity Trail sheet from the shop or village website. Responsibility of most of these footpaths are Cornwall Council.

ALLOTMENTS

The Parish Council provides 14 allotment plots on land at Vicarage Gate. There is a waiting list. Contact the clerk.
